

Multi-Casualty Incident

All Dispatch Centers

When the RP(s) provides information indicating a MCI:

1. Dispatch appropriate resources from your jurisdiction.
2. Request additional outside resources as requested/required.
3. Inform all requested resources of the potential of a MCI (**Level I** or **Level II**).
4. Inform all requested resources of the command and tactical frequencies (usually CALCORD).
5. Coordinate communications between response agencies if requested.

Termination of the MCI:

Notify all requested resources of the termination of the MCI.

Definitions:

A Level I MCI is 3 to 10 patients.

A Level II MCI is 11 or more patients.

MedCom

When the RP(s) provides information indicating a MCI or when another dispatch agency requests resources:

1. Dispatch appropriate resources from your jurisdiction, including air.
2. Inform all requested resources of the potential of a MCI (**Level I** or **Level II**).
3. Notify appropriate area's Field Supervisor** of the MCI.
 - a. San Luis Ambulance Adam 3
 - b. Cambria Operations Director
4. **For Level II MCI notify, via Watch Commander, the Public health Department for MHOAC activation.**
5. Inform all requested resources of the command and tactical frequencies (usually CALCORD).
6. Notify hospitals, via simulcast of the MCI declaration with location, mechanism and the possible number of patients.
7. If requested by the IC or the Transport Unit Leader, poll the hospitals, via simulcast for their patient availability. **Only** accept availability as a number and color.
8. Coordinate communications between response agencies if requested.

Termination of the MCI:

1. Notify all requested resources of the termination of the MCI.
2. Notify all of the hospitals, via simulcast of the termination of the MCI.
